Rachel Verinder, a young English woman, inherits a large Indian diamond on her eighteenth birthday. It is a legacy from her uncle, a corn British army officer who served in India. The diamond is of great religious significance as well as being extremely valuable, and three Hindu priests have dedicated their lives to recovering it. The story incorporates elements of the legendary origins of the Hope Diamond (or perhaps the Orloff Diamond). Rachel's eighteenth birthday is celebrated with a large party, whose guests include her cousin Franklin Blake. The Moonstone by Wilkie Collins is a 19th-century British epistolary novel, generally considered the first detective novel in the English language. The story was originally serialised in Charles Dickens' magazine All the Year Round. The Moonstone and The Woman in White are widely considered Wilkie Collins' best novels. Facts and Trivia: In 1934, the book was made into a critically acclaimed American film, The Moonstone by Monogram Pictures Corporation. Adapted to the screen by Adele S. A Study in Scarlet first appeared in 1887 in Beeton's Christmas Annual and was marked the first appearance of Sherlock Holmes and Dr. Watson, who would become the most famous detective duo in popular fiction

Sir Arthur Ignatius Conan Doyle DL (22 May 1859 - 7 July 1930) was a Scottish physician and writer who is most noted for his fictional stories about the detective Sherlock Holmes, which are generally considered milestones in the field of crime fiction. He is also known for writing the fictional adventures of a second character he invented, Professor Challenger, and for popularising the mystery of the Mary Celeste. He was a prolific writer whose other works include fantasy and science fiction stories, plays, romances, poetry, non-fiction, and historical novels. Sherlock Holmes is a fictional detective created by Scottish author and physician Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, a graduate of the

University of Edinburgh Medical School. A London-based "consulting detective" whose abilities border on the fantastic, Holmes is famous for his astute logical reasoning, his ability to adopt almost any disguise, and his use of forensic science skills to solve difficult cases. Holmes, who first appeared in publication in 1887, was featured in four novels and 56 short stories. The first novel, A Study in Scarlet, appeared in Beeton's Christmas Annual in 1887 and the second, The Sign of the Four, in Lippincott's Monthly Magazine in 1890. The character grew tremendously in popularity with the first series of short stories in The Strand Magazine, beginning with "A Scandal in Bohemia" in 1891; further series of short stories and two novels published in serial form appeared between then and 1927. The stories cover a period from around 1880 up to 1914. All but four stories are narrated by Holmes's friend and biographer, Dr. John H. Watson; two are narrated by Holmes himself ("The Blasted Soldier" and "The Lion's Mane") and two others are written in the third person ("The Mazarin Stone" and "His Last Bow"). In two stories ("The Musgrave Ritual" and "The Gloria Scott"), Holmes tells Watson the main story from his memories, while Watson becomes the narrator of the frame story. "Estudio en escarlata" ("A Study in Scarlet") es una novela de misterio escrita por Sir Arthur Conan Doyle y publicada en julio de 1887. Hubo que esperar un año para que fuera publicada esta primera novela de la serie de Sherlock Holmes, y su autor cobraría 25 libras esterlinas por todos los derechos del texto. Se la reconoce por ser la primera de las novelas en las que figura el personaje del detective, que más tarde se convertiría en uno de los mayores iconos de la novela policíaca. La novela, en dos partes, comienza con la declaración de que se trata de una «Reimpresión de las memorias del doctor John H. Watson, antiguo miembro del cuerpo médico del ejército». La historia comienza en 1881, cuando el Dr. John Watson se encuentra con un viejo amigo, Stamford. Watson se vio obligado a retirarse por una herida de guerra y, al recuperarse, fue víctima del tifus. Ahora está buscando un lugar para vivir. Stamford revela que un conocido suyo, Sherlock Holmes, está buscando a alguien para compartir el alquiler en un piso en la calle Baker, en el 221 B. Un día les llega un mensaje de Scotland Yard sobre un reciente asesinato. Holmes y Watson se proponen investigarlo. Holmes observa la acera y el jardín que conducen a la casa, antes de que Watson y él se reúnan con los inspectores Gregson y Lestrade. Los cuatro observan la escena del crimen y el cadáver masculino. Hay sangre en la habitación, pero no hay heridas en el cuerpo. También ven de los documentos que se encuentran con la persona, que se encontraba en Londres con un amigo, Joseph Stangerson. En la pared, escrito con sangre, está la palabra "RACHE" que, afirma Holmes, significa 'venganza' en alemán. Deduce que la víctima murió envenenada, y describe cómo cree que era el asesino: de metro ochenta de altura, con los pies pequeños para su estatura, de tez rubicunda, con botas de punta cuadrada. La segunda parte de la novela tiene como trasfondo la historia de los orígenes de la Iglesia Mormona que se enlazan con una historia de amor. En este punto, la historia se hace más compleja e interesante. Holmes deberá poner en acción toda su capacidad analítica para resolver el crimen, pero no la tendrá nada fácil. El lector no podrá separar sus ojos de esta novela detectivesca ya que su trama lo atará de tal forma que será difícil separarse de ella por su intrincada e interesante trama. Se recomienda como lectura obligada para lectores asiduos.

A Study in Scarlet, originally titled A Tangled Skein and published in 1887, was the first story to ever feature Detective Sherlock Homes and his trusty sidekick Watson. Written by Sir Arthur Conan Doyle in less than three weeks when he was 27, it would eventually become one of the most famous Holmes stories written, and was one of only four full-length novels starring the detective. A Study in Scarlet was also the first novel to feature a magnifying glass as a detective's tool. Scottish surgeon and political activist SIR ARTHUR CONAN DOYLE (1859-1930) turned his passions into stories and novels, producing fiction and nonfiction works sometimes controversial (The Great Boer War, 1900), sometimes fanciful (The Coming of the Fairies, 1922), and sometimes legendary (The Adventures of Sherlock Holmes, 1892).

This book by Arthur Conan Doyle is the background story to his earlier novel The White Company, and describes the early life of that book's hero Nigel Loring, a knight in the service of King Edward III in the first phase of the Hundred Years' War. The character is loosely based on the historical knight Neil Loring. Chivalric deeds, bloody battles, bouts with ships, deeds of arms, chevauchees, robber barons and clever archers abound in this nice prequel to The White Company which follows the younger years of Sir Nigel, a minor noble of a house of great renown for the bravery of his knights, now down on its fortune after the premature death of its Lord (whose memory of heroic deeds is humorously

capped by a I-slipped-on-a-bar-of soap kind of demise) and plagued by greedy men of the cloth brandishing injunctions like swords. The young and stalwart (and broke) squire Nigel dreams to live the life of the true knight, full of justice, honor, loyalty, courtesy and bravery. "Young and hot-headed with wild visions of dashing deeds and knight errantry," as skilled as candid, Nigel embarks in the adventure of his life and the reader follows him as he encounters his chivalrous warhorse, faces bureaucrat clergy, obstructs petty nobles and promises the love of his life to return after "worshipfully winning worship" following his King and Prince in France, "that land of chivalry and glory, the stage where name and fame were to be." From the English countryside to Poitiers, Doyle depicts the society of the time, its customs and particularly the flaws and virtues of its human types, the social inequality, with many parallels to the contemporary world.
