Faza'il-e-A'maal (originally titled Tablighi Nisab -Curriculum for Tabligh), is a religious text composed mainly of treatises by the Indian Deobandi hadith scholar Muhammad Zakariya Kandhlawi for Tablighi Jamaat. The book is written in simple and lucid Urdu and is a collection of pious and edifying tales, based mostly on inspirational hadith traditions and anecdotes. The Fazaail-e-Aamaal, of Hadhrat Sheikhul Hadith, MoulanaMuhammad Zakariyya Khandelwi (RA), is among the most famousand well known Islamic books in the world. Last year (1432), some members of the Ta'limi Board (KZN) visited Nizaamuddeen and met one of the elders, Hadhrat MoulanaYa'qoob Saahib (daamat barakaatuhu), the ustaaz of Moulana Sa'aadSaahib (daamat barakaatuhu). Hadhrat Moulana advised them to commence the reading of the Fazaail-e-Aamaal to the children in order to encourage them to carry out the necessary aamaal (good deeds). He mentioned that we are teaching only the masaail (laws) of salaah, etc., in the makaatib but the children will not be encouraged to perform salaah by just learning the masaail. We will have to read to them the fazaail (virtues and benefits) to encourage them to perform salaah. Hadhrat Moulana Ya'qoob Saahib (daamat barakaatuhu) also advised that the Fazaail-e-Aamaal be simplified and brought down to the level of the children so that they are encouraged to engage in Aamaal-e-Saaliha (good deeds). Therefore, in the light of Hadhrat Moulana Ya'qoob Saahib's advice, Hadhrat Mufti Ebrahim Salejee Saahib (daamat barakaatuhu), the principal of Madrasah Taleemuddeen, initiated the simplifying of the Fazaail-e-Aamaal for the benefit of the children in the makaatib. This book is divided into 7 parts, viz. Stories of Sahaabah, Virtuesof Salaah, Virtues of reciting the Quraan, Virtues of zikr, Virtues of Durood Shareef, Virtues of Ramadhaan and virtues of tableegh. Apart of each section should be read out and explained daily to the children. This should be done 5 minutes before they leave for home. Grounded in the Weberian tradition, Islam and Democracy in South Asia: The Case of Bangladesh presents a critical analysis of the complex relationship between Islam and democracy in South Asia and Bangladesh. The book posits that Islam and democracy are not necessarily incompatible, but that the former has a contributory role in the development of the latter. Islam came to Bengal largely by Sufis and missionaries through peaceful means and hence a moderate form of this religion got rooted in the society. Both militant Islam and militant secularism are equal threats to democracy and pluralism. Like democracy, political Islam has many faces. Political Islam adhering to democratic norms and practices, what the authors call "democratic Islamism," unlike "militant Islamism," is not anti-democratic. The book shows that the suppression of democracy and human rights creates avenues for the consolidation of militant Islamism, orthodox Islam, and "Islamic" terrorism, while the "fair play" of democracy results in the decline of anti-democratic form of political Islam.

New Faza'il-e-A'maal with Useful Features Original books in Urdu have been translated in English for American Muslims with the following features. It should be user friendly. Translation with easy understanding using common English words, shorter sentences, shorter paragraphs, and minimum number of Arabic words with easy spelling. All Qur'an and Hadith are described in italics throughout the books with references in bold. This will help a reader to become more careful when s/he reads a Qur'anic sentence or Hadith as compared to general explanation. All Roman translations of Qur'anic sentences are replaced with easy translation from the Noble Qur'an. All references are listed at the beginning of the books to adequately show all sources (from Hijri ~150 to ~1400) mentioned throughout the books, which refer to Qur'an and authentic Hadith. A 2-page table is added at the beginning with alphabetic names of the Qur'anic Suras to easily locate any Sura, Chapter, and Sejdah. The sequence of the books is arranged as they are read during collective A'maal. Each book has its own one letter symbol, which is used as a prefix to page numbers. Also the seven letters of the seven books are listed at the bottom of each page to show location of each book. It is easy to locate each book and reader's pre-selected item. The numbering scheme of each chapter within each book is reorganized to easily locate reader's need. Thin lines are inserted to show separation of shorter Qur'anic sentences and Hadith. All non-Arabic terms are replaced with Arabic terms, since this book is used universally for Da'wah activities. The new Fazail-e-A'maal is only 510 pages and 1 / 2 inch thick.

Not much is known about what is arguably the world's, and certainly India's, largest Islamic organization -- the Tablighi Jamaat. From poverty-stricken peasants of Bihar to dairy farmers of Mewat, its members attend three-day retreats in local mosques, and at times, the Markaz in Delhi. They come of their own free will, at their own expense. The Tabligh tells its members to look within, that life is about internal cleansing with regular prayer that paves the path to spiritual uplift. Unlike other Islamic organizations that balance the here and the hereafter, the Tabligh is concerned only about 'matters beyond the sky and under the earth'. Its steadfast refusal to take a political stand has stood it in good stead. It is the 'ideal Muslim organization' for some -- focused solely on introspection in isolation. Now, for the first time, author Ziya Us Salam provides an inside view of the organization that unwittingly became a 'hotspot' during the novel coronavirus pandemic in 2020.

Imam Muslim (Muslim ibn al-Hajjaj) was born in 202 AH in Naysabur (817/818CE) and died in 261AH (874/875CE) also in Naysabur. He traveled widely to gather his collection of ahadith (plural of hadith) from Iraq, Saudi Arabia, Syria and Egypt. Out of 300,000 hadith which he evaluated, approximately 4,000 were extracted for inclusion into his collection based on stringent acceptance criteria. Each hadith was checked and the veracity of the chain of reporters was painstakingly established. Sunni Muslims consider it the second most authentic hadith collection, after Sahih Bukhari. However, it is important to note that Imam Muslim never claimed to collect all authentic traditions as his goal was to collect only traditions that all Muslims should agree on about accuracy. It is complete book 2 and book 3 of sahih muslim.

Annotation. In the aftermath of 9/11 Islamic seminaries or madrasas received much media attention in India, mostly owing to the alleged link between madrasa education and forms of violence. Yet, while ample information on madrasas for boys is available, similar institutions of Islamic learning for girls have for the greater part escaped public attention so far.
