Le 15 juin 2011, l'Iréa a organisé un colloque sur le thème « filles-garçons en famille et à l'école : reproduction des inégalités ou éducation à l'égalité ? » Dans une conférence introductive, Nicole Mosconi évoque l'histoire des recherches sur le genre en éducation. Puis elle éclaire les concepts de genre, de sexisme et de stéréotypes du sexe. Elle rappelle des résultats de recherche sur la socialisation scolaire comme transmission de stéréotypes sexistes et sur le « curriculum caché » dans la transmission des savoirs et de ses conséquences en termes de division socio-sexuée de savoirs et du travail. Cette conférence introduit parfaitement les trois tables rondes qui ont réuni des chercheures, des universitaires, des responsables d'associations. Débats passionnants et parfois passionnés autour de trois grands thèmes : les idées reçues sur le féminin-masculin, les savoirs sont-ils neutres ? Pour ou contre la mixité scolaire ? Si besoin était, tout au long des débats de ce colloque, on s'aperçoit qu'il y a beaucoup à faire pour tendre à une véritable égalité, dans l'éducation fillesgarçons. La mixité, dans l'enseignement, se résume bien souvent à une juxtaposition, sans intégration de cette co-présence des filles et des garçons dans une même classe.

The extent of John Ruskin’s influence has long been acknowledged, though his impact on the development of Anglo-American modernism has received little systematic attention. In this volume, published to mark the centenary of Ruskin’s death, a group of international scholars consider what is often an awkward and conflicted relation. Ruskin shelter an incipient modernism whose antipathy to a degraded modernity, powerfully predicts a major current within the work of the new century.

First published in 1943, The Little Prince by Antoine de Saint-Exupéry has been translated into more than 250 languages, becoming a global phenomenon. The Sahara desert is the scenery of Little Prince’s story. The narrator’s plane has crashed there and he has scarcely some food and water to survive. Trying to comprehend what caused the crash, the Little Prince appears. The serious blonde little boy asks to draw him a sheep. The narrator consents to the strange fellow’s request. They soon become friends and the Little Prince informs the pilot that he is from a small planet, the asteroid 325, talks to him about the baobabs, his planet volcanoes and the mysterious rose that grew on his planet. He also talks to him about their friendship and the lie that evoked his journey to other planets. Often puzzled by the grown-ups’ behavior, the little traveler becomes a total and eternal symbol of innocence and love, of responsibility and devotion. Through him we get to see how insightful children are and how grown-ups aren’t. Children use their heart to feel what’s really important, not the eyes. Heart-breaking, funny and thought-provoking, it is an enchanting and endlessly wise fable about the human condition and the power of imagination. A book about both childhood and adulthood, it can be read as a parable, a war story, a classic children’s fairy-tale, and many more things besides: The Little Prince is a book for everyone; after all, all grown-ups were children once.

France, Vietnam, and the Ambivalence of Interculturality

*Girl, Edna O’Brien’s hotly anticipated new novel, envisages the lives of the Boko Haram girls in a masterpiece of violence and tenderness. I was a girl once, but not anymore. So begins Girl, Edna O’Brien’s harrowing portrayal of the young women abducted by Boko Haram. Set in the deep countryside of northeast Nigeria, this is a brutal story of incarceration, horror, and hunger; a hair-raising escape into the manifold terrors of the forest; and a descent into the labyrinthine bureaucracy and hostility awaiting a victim who returns home with a child blighted by enemy blood. From one of the century’s greatest living authors, Girl is an unforgettable story of one victim’s astonishing survival, and her unflinching faith in the redemption of the human heart.*

*This book explores literary representations of cultural hybridity spanning nearly half a century, a period marked by major shifts in Franco-Vietnamese relations. How can identity be thought and represented outside of the oppositional categories that divide cultures, histories, languages and races? Can the intercultural subject be understood as more than a site of cultural contestation, as anything other than a confrontation between incompatible binary opposites? This book offers compelling responses to these questions through a series of close readings of francophone novels written by Vietnamese authors during and just after the colonial period. While many contemporary studies of cultural hybridity tend to privilege the postmodern, deconstructive play of postcolonial identities, Disorientation seeks to uncover what is often obscured in such celebratory analyses: the rigid and potentially traumatic conditions under which colonized subjects experienced the tensions and contradictions of intercultural identity. The close readings that form the core of the book are inflected by cultural and historical considerations, and informed by a range of primary documents that includes training manuals for colonial administrators, works of imperialist propaganda, tourist guidebooks and travel writing, and textbooks from Franco-Vietnamese schools. These contextualized analyses recast the problem of interculturality in an Asian francophone context, expanding the historical and cultural fields within which questions of identity and difference are currently discussed and offering a striking perspective from which to question postcolonial theories of hybridity.*

He lives among them for ten months,

*Un ouvrage pour comprendre les défis que représente l'autisme dans le monde scolaire. L'autisme à l'école est une différence invisible et marquante à la fois. L'Autre avec autisme nous met en demeure de réfléchir sur nos pratiques, mais surtout, de réfléchir sur nous-même. Urgence d'une société solidaire et inclusive, l'autisme est une question d'éthique et de droit, de science et d'humanité. Il s'adresse ainsi à tous ceux et celles, parents, enseignants, AVS (AESH), éducateurs, professionnels, formateurs et chercheurs qui, dans leur pratique et leur expérience de vie, sont en première ligne sur le front de l'autisme à l'école. Au travers d'un ouvrage basé sur de nombreuses recherches et une solide expérience de terrain, l'auteur décortique avec justesse la place que prend l'autisme à l'école et les enjeux de l'insertion. EXTRAIT Le consensus international est acté. L'autisme est une différence plus qu'une maladie (Mottron, 2012) qu'il serait possible de guérir par un traitement médical approprié. À ce jour, aucun traitement médicamenteux ne guérit l'autisme ou les TED. Il s'agit d'un symptôme pour lequel il n'existe pas de marqueur biologique spécifique ni de syndrome précis (Skorupka & Amet, 2017). Pour autant, l'accompagnement de l'autisme demande un suivi biomédical et nutritionnel ajusté à la singularité du sujet TSA. « Certains médicaments sont utilisés pour traiter les pathologies associées aux troubles du développement, comme l'épilepsie. » (Barthélémy, 2013) Sur le plan sémantique, la littérature spécialisée et les chercheurs préfèrent plutôt parler des autismes ou de spectre autistique que d'autisme, à cause de l'hétérogénéité du syndrome, à laquelle se rajoute le caractère unique de chaque individu. Dans le monde anglo-saxon, c'est la publication, en 2013, de la cinquième édition de l'outil d'évaluation et d'accompagnement Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders (DSM-5) qui est en vigueur. Elle classe le trouble du spectre de l'autisme dans les troubles neuro-développementaux. Sémantique précisée, l'autisme renvoie à une catégorie de troubles neuro-développementaux qui recouvrent des situations cliniques diverses. Il rend compte de situations de handicap hétérogènes qui impliquent la proposition de réponses variées et adaptées aux spécificités propres et singulières de chaque situation vécue. Cette diversité est précisée sous forme de catégories ou sous forme dimensionnelle. L'idée s'est développée que ces catégories sont de simples variantes d'une même pathologie et constituent le continuum d'un même trouble : le trouble du spectre de l'autisme (TSA). À PROPOS DE L'AUTEUR Christian Alin est Professeur émérite des universités en Sciences de l'éducation à L'ESPE de l'université de Lyon1 et membre du laboratoire L'VIS - EA-7428, Lyon. Ses travaux de recherche et ses interventions portent sur l'analyse des pratiques d'enseignement et sur la formation des formateurs. Depuis la naissance de son petit-fils, porteur d'autisme, il a orienté ses travaux sur les questions de formation que sont la vulnérabilité, l'autisme et l'éducation inclusive. Il est président de l'association ACACIA, affiliée à Autisme-France.*

*This groundbreaking study on the psycholinguistics of spelling presents the author's original empirical research on spelling and supplies the theoretical framework necessary to understand how children's ability to write is related to their ability to speak a language. The author explores areas in a field dominated by work traditionally concerned with the psychodynamics of reading skills and, in so doing, highlights the importance of learning to spell for both psycholinguists and educators, since as they begin to spell, children attempt to represent the phonological, or sound form, of words.
