

La Dama In Verde Ghost Ladies Vol 3

In 1970's Chile Pablo Neruda, the Nobel-prize winning poet, is close to death, and he senses the end of an era in Chilean politics but there is one final secret he must resolve. He recruits Cayetano Brulé, a young Cuban rogue, as his "own private Maigret" and lends Brulé the novels of Simenon as a crash course in the role of private detective. Brulé must travel across the world, through Neruda's past and the political faiths he has espoused, retracing the poet's life from Fidel Castro's Cuba to Berlin, Mexico City to Bolivia. Brulé desperately tries to fulfil Neruda's final request amid the brutal beginning of Pinochet's dictatorship while all the poet once believed in is swept away. Evocative and romantic, *The Neruda Case* spans lies and truth, travelling between uneasy peace and political coup, from life to death. Brulé, a daydreamer and reluctant detective, is lost among Latin America's uncertainties, venality and corruption while his first case introduces one of the great characters of international crime fiction. Among the pleasures of *The Neruda Case* is its provocative fictional portrait of Pablo Neruda, as the poet re-evaluates his life and begins to question abandoning those he loved for his poetry. This is the first English language translation of Roberto Ampuero's atmospheric Brulé detective novels and brings South American noir to a new audience.

He wasn't civilized or tame. He had his own code and he lived by it. Monk. Bounty hunter. Vampire slayer. Andre Boroi has spent centuries battling the undead, holding out against the dark with honor. But now, gravely wounded by master vampire Costin Popescu, Andre will be easy to track - his spilled blood marking the killing trail for Popescu and his hungry band of underlings. Andre's only chance is to disappear into the gray mist of the Carpathians. To wait. To hope. She had a healing touch and a scent that was his lifeblood. In the mountains in search of a precious crystal, geologist Teagan Joanes suddenly finds herself hunted by those she once trusted. Then she comes across the warrior- wounded, wanting and irresistible. Andre has been craving her for an eternity: his lifemate. Her warmth envelops him. Her scent pulsates. And with every beat of her heart, Teagan surrenders to a passion she can't possibly comprehend. Now they are bound by destiny, but is it enough to keep them safe from a stalking, relentless darkness that threatens to swallow them alive?

La dama grigia, fantasma collegato a creature infelici che ripercorrono antichi cammini; la dama bianca, spirito familiare e messaggero di tristi annunci nei grandi casati nobiliari; la dama verde, spettro generato da un destino tragico... e tre donne, ciascuna legata in modo diverso al soprannaturale, in un mondo ancora lontano dagli esperimenti medianici di epoca vittoriana. Dall'Autrice di "La Dama in Bianco" Antonia Romagnoli, copywriter, è un'autrice piacentina che si occupa di romance storici e di fantasy. Finalista al Premio Galassia 2006, ha esordito con alcuni racconti fantastici in riviste e antologie. Ha pubblicato nel 2008 per le Edizioni l'Età dell'Acquario "Il segreto dell'Alchimista", primo volume della Saga delle Terre, finalista al Premio Italia 2009. Il secondo episodio della saga, "I Signori delle Colline", è uscito nel febbraio 2009. "Triagrion", il terzo episodio della saga, è uscito nel 2010 con Edizioni Domino. I tre romanzi, seguiti nel 2016 dal prequel "Aerys - il potere del fuoco" sono stati riproposti da Delos Digital nella collana Fantasy. "Aerys" è arrivato in finale al Premio Italia 2017. Con Domino ha pubblicato anche due fiabe per la prima infanzia. Nel 2015 e 2016 ha pubblicato in modo autonomo i romance storici "La dama in grigio" e "Il libertino di Hidden Brook", dedicandosi al periodo Regency e vittoriano, ai quali ha dedicato anche il suo blog "il salotto di Miss Darcy". Ha curato l'antologia "Natale a Pemberley" uscita nel dicembre 2017, e "Fantasmi a Northanger Abbey", 2018, organizzate dal gruppo Regency & Victorian. Nel 2018 è uscito il volume "Regency & Victorian - in viaggio fra usi e costumi dell'800 inglese", che raccoglie i principali articoli del blog sull'epoca Regency e Vittoriana. Scritto intorno al 1400 da un poeta anonimo, Sir Gawain e il Cavaliere Verde venne riscoperto solo quattrocento anni dopo e pubblicato per la prima volta in Gran Bretagna nel 1839. Ambientato alla corte di re Artù, il poema narra dell'apparizione, durante le feste di Natale, di un misterioso cavaliere completamente verde che lancia una sfida, raccolta dal giovane sir Gawain. Il cavaliere verde si lascerà colpire con

l'ascia, a patto che il suo avversario si presenti un anno dopo al suo cospetto per farsi colpire a sua volta. Inizia così per Gawain un anno di vagabondaggi in cerca della cappella verde, dove dovrà mantenere la parola data. Ghost story, thriller, romanzo d'amore e d'avventura, il poema è una delle grandi storie inglesi scritte in Middle English e a partire dalla prima pubblicazione in epoca vittoriana ha suscitato l'interesse di moltissimi studiosi, poeti, ma anche di studenti o semplici appassionati che si sono cimentati nella sua traduzione. Interesse che ha spinto anche Simon Armitage a proporre questa nuova versione, che mira a rendere accessibile al lettore la storia, ma anche a far conoscere il «suono» del testo originale, un testo altamente allitterativo e ritmato. E così anche nella resa in inglese moderno Armitage privilegia questa caratteristica che, come scrive nella sua introduzione, è «l'ordito e la trama del poema, senza i quali non restano che tanti bei fili... Lo schema percussivo delle parole ha la funzione di rafforzarne il contenuto e trapiantarle nella memoria.» Lo stesso ha cercato di fare Massimo Bocchiola nella traduzione italiana, con il medesimo intento di Armitage, cioè quello di «fare poesia».

In this dazzling multidisciplinary tour of Mexico City, Mauricio Tenorio-Trillo focuses on the period 1880 to 1940, the decisive decades that shaped the city into what it is today. A kaleidoscope of expository forms, *I Speak of the City* connects the realms of literature, architecture, music, popular language, art, and public health to investigate the city in a variety of contexts: as a living history textbook, as an expression of the state, as a metropolis, as a capital, as a laboratory, and as language. Tenorio's formal imagination allows the reader to revel in the free-flowing richness of his narratives, opening startling new vistas onto the urban experience. From art to city planning, from epidemiology to poetry, this book challenges the conventional wisdom about both Mexico City and the turn-of-the-century world to which it belonged. And by engaging directly with the rise of modernism and the cultural experiences of such personalities as Hart Crane, Mina Loy, and Diego Rivera, *I Speak of the City* will find an enthusiastic audience across the disciplines.

Against the backdrop of nineteenth-century Oaxaca City, Kathryn Sloan analyzes raptorial trials--cases of abduction and/or seduction of a minor--to gain insight beyond the act of crime and into the reality that testimonies by parents, their children, and witnesses reveal about courtship practices, generational conflict, the negotiation of honor, and the relationship between the state and its working-class citizens in post colonial Mexico. Unlike the colonial era where paternal rule was absolute, Sloan found that the state began to usurp parental authority in the home with the introduction of liberal reform laws. As these laws began to shape the terms of civil marriage, the courtroom played a more significant role in the resolution of familial power struggles and the restoration of family honor in raptorial cases. Youths could now exert a measure of independence by asserting their rights to marry whom they wished. In examining these growing rifts between the liberal state and familial order within its lower order citizens, Sloan highlights the role that youths and the working class played in refashioning systems of marriage, honor, sexuality, parental authority, and filial obedience.
