It considers whether supporting commercial expectations is a justifiable aim of the law according to three well-established theoretical approaches to contractual obligations: rights-based explanations, efficiency-based (or economic) explanations and the relational contract critique of the classical law. It explores the specific challenges presented to contract law by modern commercial relationships and the ways in which the general rules of contract law could be designed and applied in order to meet these challenges. Ultimately the book seeks to move contract law beyond a simple dichotomy between contextualist and formalist legal reasoning, to a more nuanced and responsive legal approach to the regulation of commercial agreements.***

Existential sentences in the world's languages tend to develop specific morphological, syntactic, and lexical properties. The present work offers a contrastive functional analysis of these constructions in two typologically unrelated languages, English and Lithuanian. The study focuses on the relationship between the syntactic structure of different existential sentence types and their meaning; it also explores the semantic and pragmatic parameters relevant to the structural differences within a single language and across the two compared languages. Most importantly, a new definition of the existential sentence, which takes into account both semantic and syntactic criteria, is proposed for Lithuanian. The

findings are drawn on the basis of the corpus and highlight conspicuous differences in the linguistic representations of the construction in the two languages. With respect to Lithuanian, communicative word order variations, language-specific structures (the BkI and the impersonal passive), and a wider use of lexical verbs present an area of special interest. Against the methodological backdrop of historical and comparative folk narrative research, *101 Middle Eastern Tales and Their Impact on Western Oral Tradition* surveys the history, dissemination, and characteristics of over one hundred narratives transmitted to Western oral tradition from or by the Middle Eastern Muslim literatures (i.e., authored written works in Arabic, Persian, and Ottoman Turkish). A tale to be included, Ulrich Marzolph considered two criteria: that the tale originates from or at least was transmitted by a Muslim source, and that it was recorded from a Western narrator's oral performance in the course of the nineteenth or twentieth century. The rationale behind these restrictive definitions is predicated on Marzolph's main concern with the long-lasting effect that some "Oriental" narratives exercised in Western popular tradition—those tales that have withstood the test of time. Marzolph focuses on originally "Oriental" tales that became part and parcel of modern Western oral tradition. Since antiquity, the "Orient" constituted the quintessential Other vis-à-vis the European cultures. While delineation against this Other served to define and reassure the Self, the "Orient" also constituted a constant source of fascination, attraction, and inspiration. Through oral retellings, numerous tales from Muslim tradition became an integral part of European oral and written tradition in the form of learned treatises, medieval sermons, medieval fabliaux, early modern chapbooks, contemporary magazines, and more. In present times, when national narcissisms continue to delineate the status of strongholds delineating the Us against the Other, it is imperative to distinguish, document, visualize, and discuss those in which the West is not only indebted to the Muslim world but also shares common features with Muslim narrative tradition. *101 Middle Eastern Tales and Their Impact on Western Oral Tradition* is an important contribution to this debate and a vital work for scholars, students, and readers of folklore and fairy tales.
