Have you ever walked through that door?" Or DOWNLOAD - "Downloading this file or picture reminds me of the time I downloaded Jesus into my heart. Have you ever done that download?" SALT & PEPPER - "These salt and pepper shakers remind me of the Kingdom of Light and the Kingdom of darkness." Or BREAD - This bread reminds me of what Jesus said: "I Am the Bread of Life. He who comes to Me will never go hungry," (John 6:35). Or SUGAR - This sugar reminds me of how sweet it is to trust in Jesus. After you say the icebreaker, you LISTEN to what they say in response and then be led by the spirit in what you say next. It is a "no fail" way to witness to the lost because, even if they do not accept Jesus at that moment, the object is still there to continue to remind them of what you said long after you are gone. After you say the icebreaker, the chapter "Truth to Say to 13 False Religions" will help you even more to witness to: Atheists & Evolutionists, Buddhists, Hindus, Jehovah Witnesses, Jewish people, Mormons, Muslims, New Agers, Scientologists, Unitarian Universalists and Homosexuals and Lesbians. There is also a chapter called Prophetic Evangelism that teaches you how to witness using a word of knowledge that God gives you to deliver a prophetic word to witness to the lost. Years ago, the author had a startling realization. Theologians and pastors have long taught on the glory of God and its central importance in the Bible. However, because he was living in East Asia, it also dawned on the author that this sort of talk about God's glory, praising Him, and magnifying His name was simply another way of talking about honor and shame. When the author looked at most theology and ministry-related books, he found that honor and shame seemed to be treated differently. Anthropologists talked about honor-shame, but theologians largely focused more on legal metaphors. It was in the year of 1976 that the Lord sovereignly and miraculously spoke to me to begin studying and publishing Biblical teachings to be shared with a world-wide audience. For the encouragement of others, I will now recount this event that began with the first teaching the Lord gave me. As I was sitting at my desk in the pastor's study of the church taking care of administrative duties, suddenly and unexpectedly, not audibly but rather in my spirit, to "clear the desk, get out a blank sheet of paper and pen because I want to teach you." The only things I had on my desk were a picture of my wife and children, a calendar, and a pen. It was such a shocking experience, that I really didn't know what he meant by "clearing the desk." So at first I just moved them around on the desk. Then I heard the Lord say "clear the desk!" So, I took these three items from my desk and moved them to my book shelf. In obedience to Him, I got out a blank piece of paper and a pen and just sat still waiting for the Lord to tell me what to do next. Then the Lord began to teach me the following specific truths about His Word, the Scripture as recorded in the Holy Bible: 1. There is a thread that runs through the Bible from beginning to end on any given subject that contains the whole counsel of God. 2. When researching any subject, read and record every Scripture passage pertaining to that topic. 3. For every word in Scripture there is a meaning, and works, heaven and hell, angels and demons, etc. 4. My Word is perfectly balanced. 5. Do not teach anything before you have the balance to that subject. 6. Record the entire Scripture passage on every subject. 7. Print out My Word directly from the Bible passages. 8. The best commentary on the Bible is the Bible. 9. Do not make this a commentary of your teachings but rather of My Word. 10. I am the primary Teacher. 11. Only use Hebrew and Greek definitions of words to clarify word meanings. 12. The Bible does not contradict itself, so keep reading until the answer is found. 13. My Word is the Truth. 14. On either side of the "plumb-line" of Truth there are two ditches: Legalism and License. 15. The Truth sets you free and you are free indeed. What began as one teaching has developed into hundreds of teachings to these principles and directives that I have adhered and have recorded the teachings He has revealed to me over the past 40 years.
