These points are so obvious and so generally recognized that they would not be worth emphasizing, except for one fact. In practice the plain inference from them is generally not drawn; instead, a course diametrically opposite to such an inference is followed. Most of our required courses in composition lay heavy emphasis upon rhetorical theory. Students are required to buy two or even three text-books, and much more than half the time of the course is devoted to recitations and discussions of text-book assignments. Further, most text-books include more material than any experienced teacher will use. The newer texts, it is true, present theory less elaborately than some of the older ones; but they are padded out by illustrative matter to about the same bulk. To the experienced teacher, this surplusage of material is an inconvenience; to the inexperienced teacher, who is in charge of the great majority of freshman sections, it is a series of stumbling-blocks; to the student it is a source of bewilderment.
