This book focuses upon the tomb with a transi image, which the author defines as 'a tomb with a representation of the deceased as a corpse, shown either nude or wrapped in a shroud', tombs that were peculiar to Northern Europe from the late fourteenth through the seventeenth centuries. Cohen challenges the modern view that the transi image was a mere memento mori for the living. Drawing upon 200 examples of tombs with, as well as without transi images, and upon poetry, church hymns, prayers, sermons, ceremonial texts, and wills, she demonstrates that in the course of the 15th & 16th centuries the meaning of the transi evolved, reflecting changes in religious, social and intellectual life during this period.

In this Sketch of the Appomattox River and Lower Reaches of Swift Creek we take a virtual trip up these two streams, reviewing over forty of these Colonial and Antebellum estates, navigation of sailing vessels, steamships and batteaux encompassing over 100 miles, and the plight of the Native Americans who once occupied the lower reaches of these waters. We also look at the Appomattox River's connection with the Underground Railroad and the free-black community of Pocahontas at Petersburg, Virginia. The milling industries that once thrived along these waters are reviewed and an in-depth look is given to three of the largest of these facilities that began operations in 1836. Centuries of sports, recreation and other uses of these streams are also included here. While many topics included in this volume are available in other sources, the consolidation of such a wide array of information and the introduction of new material will be of interest to anyone who would be inclined to step back in time to the Power and the Glory of the Appomattox River and the lower reaches of Swift Creek.
